What is a Patient-Centered Medical Home?

A Patient-Centered Medical Home (PCMH) is a program, supported by Blue Cross Blue Shield of MI (BCBSM), which provides a comprehensive approach to Primary Care for children, youth and adults. The PCMH is a health care setting that facilitates partnerships between indvidual patients, their physicians and the patient's family.

Does my child have to be covered by BCBSM to participate?

No. All patients of this Primary Care Office are eligible for participation in PCMH regardless of health plan affiliation.

Are all Primary Care Physicians participating in this program?

No. Inclusion in the PCMH Designation Program is limited to a group of Primary Care Physicians, collaboratively selected by Blue Cross Blue Shield of Michigan and United hysicians, P.C. for their recognized quality of care and early progress in implementing PCMH processes.

How will my child benefit as a patient?

Children and their parents who elect to receive care through the PCMH model will benefit by the following: access to doctors who utilize improved technologies to stay better connected with the medical community and manage care more efficiently; more focused, personal interaction with doctors and care teams who will help navigate through the complex healthcare system; a more comprehensive delivery of primary care through the improved coordination of care, managed by the patient's personal doctor and their care team.

What do I have to do as a parent?

As a parent you will have to commit to improving your child's healthcare and work with your child's physician to help achieve goals set by both you and your child.

What can I expect for my child?

Your child will have access to a single point of comprehensive care that addresses the full range of your child's healthcare needs. Your child's care will be guided by your Primary Care Physician who will work closely with other members of your child's medical team. You will share in making decisions regarding your child's care. You, your child and the doctor will create a health care plan designed to help achieve maximum wellness.

How will the office visit change?

We will ask how we can help improve your child's health. You and your child will be educated with tools that explain the concept of PCMH, which will outline your resposibilities. Medication review and management will be provided at every visit. Action plan and goal setting to ensure all guidelines are followed.

Additional information:

your child will have access to a doctor on call 24 hours per day, 7 days a week. All patient information will continue to remain confidential. All care will be geared to help accomplish your child's personal healthcare goals.

By choosing to participate in a Patient-Centered Medical Home, I agree to:

- *Make sure my child's doctor knows his or her entire medical history
- *Tell my child's doctor all of the medications he or she is taking
- *Keep my child's appointments as scheduled
- *Consult my child's doctor before making an appointment with a specialist
- *Request that any other doctor my child sees sends a report, copies of lab work, test results and x-rays
- *Know my child's insurance and what it covers
- *Provide the office feedback on how they can improve
